How screening is helping the fight against bowel cancer

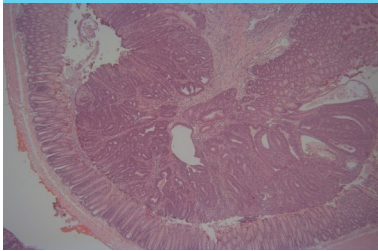
