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Funding a business

Basically 5 types of funding to consider:

- 1. Money from the founders and the "3 F's"
- 2.Free money (grants get them wherever you can)
- **3**.Soft loans (repayment holidays or low interest rates and WG Repayable Business Finance)
- 4.Debt (at normal commercial rates) need revenues
- 5.Equity (the <u>selling</u> of a stake in the business) common in start-up situations





Who are business angels?

- 'High net worth' individuals, or 'sophisticated investors'
- Positively consider seed-corn, pre-revenue and early stage opportunities
- Tend to take a five year view (3 7)
- Make small to moderate investments (= £20K to £250K)
- Average investment in Wales is £150k
- Take an equity stake usually a minority %
- Looking for exceptional returns





Are you investment ready? – what business angels look for

- An experienced and credible management team
- Proprietary or patented technology and strong USPs
- Niche market with serious growth potential
- A realistic and deliverable business plan
- What you have actually achieved so far
- A strong market position and an exceptional return
- Often an active role utilising their skills and contacts
- A clear exit route after 5 years (flotation, trade sale or buy back)
- SEIS / EIS tax relief if available





"Investment ready?" – what you need

- Short 1-page "bullish" summary (for *xénos* Bulletin)
- Executive Summary this is the single most important document
- Full 3 year Business Plan (with Yr. 1 in detail)
 - Industry sector and market opportunity
 - Details of product/service
 - USPs and IP
 - The management team
 - Market and **routes to market** (marketing and sales plans)
 - Financial projections; funding requirements and equity deal
- A 10 minute business pitch; a 1 minute speed pitch





xénos achievements

- Operating since 1997:
 - ✓ 1,150 investee companies seeking investment
 - ✓ Over 700 angels recruited
 - ✓ Over £35 million direct investment facilitated in 270 deals since 2001
- 120+ angels currently registered
- Averaging circa £2.5M investment each year
- *xénos* partnership with London funds, giving access to overseas investors as well as SEIS & EIS funds
- *xénos* contract with Swansea University





What can you expect?

Intelligent Worming – start-up and expansion phases; equine health laboratory services	£ 685,000 in 4 funding rounds from a single investor after an initial £25K investment
Haemair – University spin-in; medical equipment - artificial lung	£ 763,000 in 14 funding rounds from one <i>xénos</i> investor group. Co-investment with Finance Wales
Symiconnect – early stage; informatics system for the NHS	£ 145,000 from a <i>xénos</i> -linked SEIS fund + £ 200,000 from a Tier1 overseas investor + £ 300,000 from a corporate investor
Veloscient – start-up inward investment; medical transcription software	£ 200,000 from a Tier1 investor through <i>xénos</i> -linked London fund managers
Jellagen – start-up; medical grade jellyfish collagen	£ 150,000 initial SEIS investment from <i>xénos</i> and SWAIN. Co-investment with Finance Wales
Cell Mogrify – Bristol University spin-out and inward investment to Wales; reconfiguration factors for human cell types	£ 300,000 SEIS/EIS <i>xénos</i> 4-member syndicate



A recent *xénos* investment and the advantages of co-investment







- Medtech high-growth start-up company: initially funded by Welsh Govnt. £100K innovation grant
- ✓ SEIS qualifying *xénos* / SWAIN initial investment £150K
- ✓ Co-investment with Finance Wales £400K
- ✓ Valuation, DD, legals by FW
- ✓ Further round £1.533M through MedCity/London Business Angels, Finance Wales and *xénos* co-investment (April 2016)
